Directions To Lake Murray Resort:

Unless you complete the included One-Way Bus Ticket Form, Parents are responsible for getting their children to camp on Sunday, June 17. All parents are responsible for picking their children up from camp on Friday, June 22. There will *not* be a bus from camp to DFW. Band camp is about 90 minutes north of Dallas & Ft. Worth.

<u>Dallas & Ft. Worth Area Directions:</u> I-35 North across the Texas/Oklahoma Border to Exit #24. Go East (Turn Right when you exit) towards Lake Murray Lodge. You will go about 2 miles down the road, passing the golf course, landing strip, and the chapel. The road ends at the Lake Murray Resort office.

Packing Suggestions & Spending Money:

All linens and towels are provided by the hotel, however we suggest you bring the following items: blanket, personal hygiene items, alarm clock, sunscreen, swimsuit, beach towel, instrument, all instrument supplies, music stand, spiral notebook and pencils, hat or cap, and spending money. We also suggest that you send some snack items with your child. Cereal, granola bars, chips, fruit, and favorite treats are encouraged. Feel free to send a small ice chest to hold canned drinks and lots of bottled water. All meals are included in the camp fee, however spending money for snacks, drinks and souvenirs will be necessary. To lower the amount of spending money necessary for the camp we suggest all students prepay for all their extra recreational items (see enclosed prepaid recreational items form). **Unused prepaid items are non-refundable**. Anyone who wishes to secure his or her money during the camp will be able to deposit additional cash with a staff member. Cash should be deposited in lower denominations (\$1 and \$5 bills) as change will not be available at check-in.

Friday Morning, June 22 Camp Finale Concert:

To conclude our annual summer camp the students will present a Band Camp Finale Concert. Many of the groups that rehearsed during the camp will perform. The concert will begin at 9:00am; all friends and family are welcome to attend. **All Parents should pick up their children after the concert.** Please make sure that your student has not forgotten any items at camp.

Music Learning Band Camp 2018 Audition Information

An important part of Band Camp is the audition process. Every band member will participate in a low-pressure band interview/audition. The interview/audition allows each camper to meet with one of the band directors to discuss which band might be the best for their growth during camp and any personal goals for the week. Campers will play their instrument during the interview/audition. There will be three components to the playing part of the audition:

Prepared Piece: Campers should have a short 8 - 16 measure piece to perform at their audition. This can be an excerpt from a piece you played in band, an exercise, or an original creation. Your prepared piece should highlight your abilities on your instrument.

Sight Reading: Campers will sight read a piece of music. The sight-reading difficulty will be based on each camper's ability and goals for the week.

Scales: Scales are an important part of learning a musical instrument. According to your level, please be prepared to play the following scale(s) at your audition/interview:
